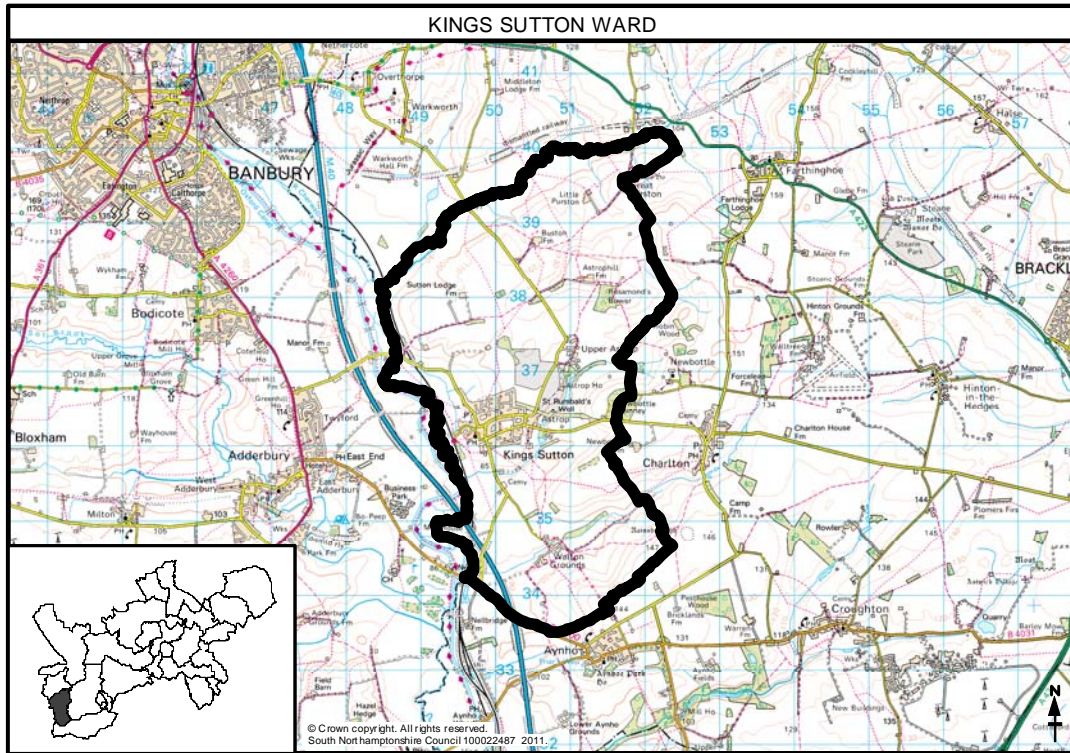

## Purpose

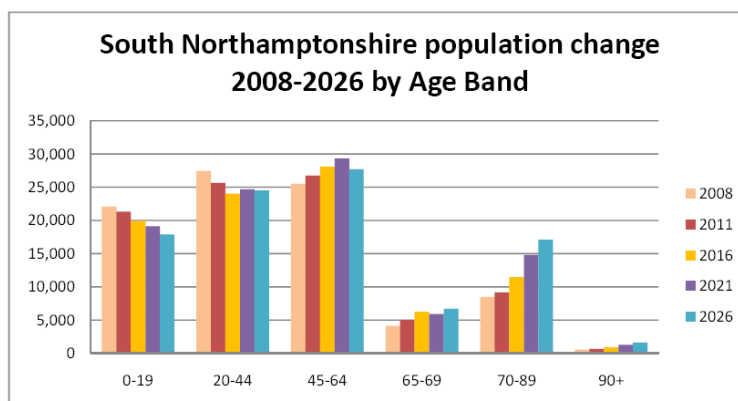
The purpose of this profile is to provide facts and figures to support rural settlements DPD and Neighbourhood Planning.

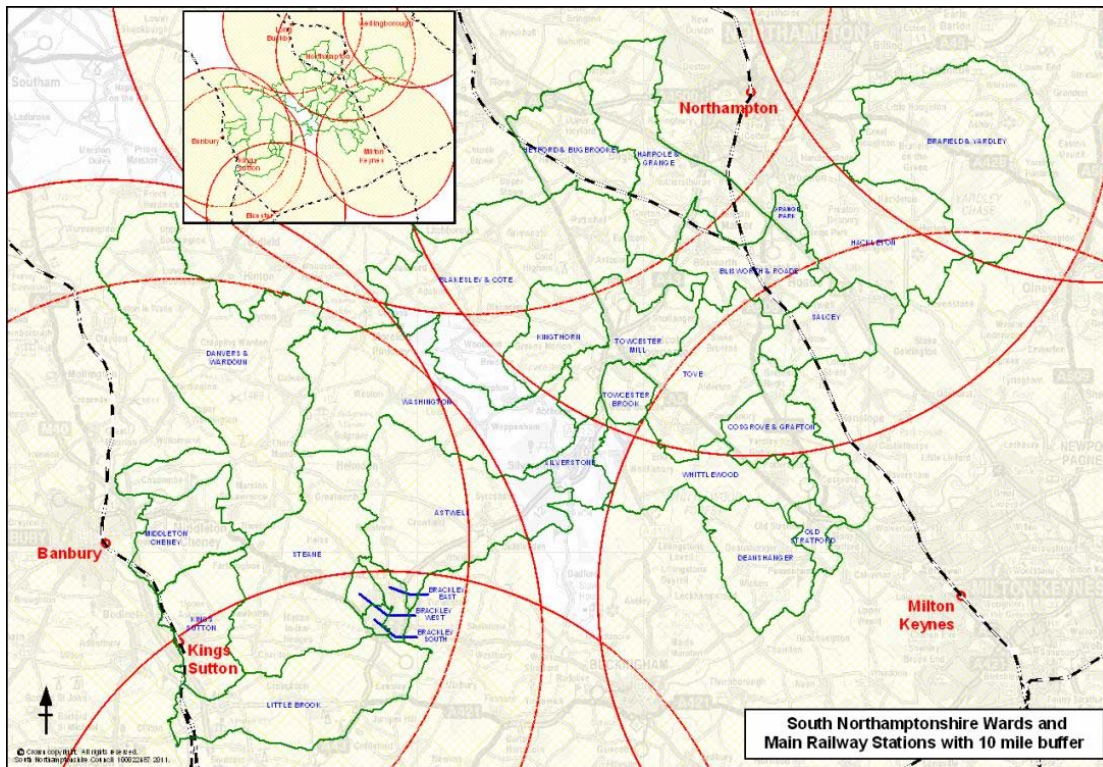
